Reasons to do an Internship:


Have you ever thought of starting an internship? Well, if you're waiting for a sign, this is it!

Kick Start a Career at School:

Australian School-based Apprenticeships (ASbAs or SBATs), also known as school-based apprenticeships and traineeships are now some of the many options students should be considering as a study pathway. School-based apprenticeships and traineeships allow students to combine study towards their high school certificate with a vocational qualification and paid on-the-job training.

There are many benefits for students undertaking a school based apprenticeship including:

- A hands-on learning experience at work and at vocational training
- Earning a wage while undertaking training
- Gaining a work history, an understanding of workplaces and employer expectations
- Kick starting a career while still at school which may transition into full time employment or a continuation of an apprenticeship at the end of secondary school.

ASbA/SBAT study effort builds toward a formal, nationally recognised qualification in a field relevant to their career path and contributes to their high school certificate.

Some ASbAs/SBATs may be ongoing post school, but after you complete your apprenticeship or traineeship you will still be able to go to university, upskill to a higher level qualification or even start your own business.

School based apprenticeships can be done in a range of areas. The graph below shows the 10 most popular school based apprenticeship and traineeship Training Programs.

Teacher's Bursary:

If you're in year 11 or 12 and want to become a teacher, some Higher Education Institutions (often referred to as universities) offer programs that allow you to start studying subjects toward your teaching degree before you graduate high school.

If you have been accepted into one of these programs, you may be able to be provided with additional financial and peer support to get you started in your teaching career with the Future Teachers Bursary.

Why apply?

You can finish your teaching degree faster as you will have completed some of the required tertiary subjects while you're still at school.

The cost of the subjects you study while at school will be covered. Generally, universities cover payment for the first unit you complete. If the cost isn't already funded, we'll cover the total cost of the tertiary unit.

You can also receive up to \$200 to help cover study costs related to your program. This may include textbooks, stationery, photocopying, and campus visits.

Introduction to Actuarial Science (online course):

The course has been carefully designed for students from a wide variety of backgrounds, with secondary/high school level being the only assumption of mathematical background. You learn:

- The basics of actuarial science
- Valuing series of cash flows
- Incorporating uncertainty into cash flows due to investment and mortality
- Monte-Carlo simulation of uncertain cash flows in Excel (or an equivalent spreadsheet tool)
- Applying actuarial techniques to life insurance and predicting human life expectancy
- How actuarial science is used in finance, investments, banking and insurance



Don't be scared that the course will be "just a whole lot of mathematics". Together, they will go beyond the math to learn how actuaries approach problems relating to risk, using examples from:

- Finance
- Investments
- Banking
- Insurance
