UCAT Quick Facts

- the UCAT (University Clinical Aptitude Test) is a 2-hour computer-based test
- the UCAT will be offered on a choice of dates throughout the month of July 2022, rather than on one single date
- some pathways to medicine/dentistry/clinical sciences will not require the UCAT and some courses may require another test
- Students are encouraged to browse <u>University</u>
 <u>Clinical Aptitude Test (UCAT)</u>
- Students are recommended to watch the <u>UCAT</u>
 <u>FAQs</u> which addresses general questions about
 the UCAT
- <u>UCAT practice tests</u> are to assist students in familiarising themselves with the type of questions they can expect to see in the test

Australian National University

<u>Direct applications</u> for 2023 admissions are now open. Interested students must be eligible for an ATAR and will be assessed on Year 11 results and <u>Co-Curricular or Service requirement (CCS)</u>.

CCS is a mandatory section of the ANU application asking you to demonstrate involvement in activities outside the classroom including sport, paid work, volunteering and more.

Applications close on 23 May 2022 and outcomes will be released 5 September 2022.

FEATURED SCHOLARSHIP

Recipients of the <u>Tuckwell Scholarship Program</u> at the ANU will receive:

- \$22,350 per annum (2021 rate) (increasing with inflation) for each year of the length of their undergraduate degree, to cover on-campus residential costs, books, and general living expenses
- priority access guaranteed to ANU-approved student accommodation
- an annual allowance of up to \$2,000 to assist with their move to Canberra and to support two annual return journeys (e.g., airfares) between their home and the University for each year of their degree. The allowance will be dependent on the proximity of their family home to ANU.
- an allowance to help cover the transport costs for your parents to attend Commencement Weekend at the start of the program, and
- an ANU Sports Centre membership for the length of their degree.



Charles Sturt University

The Charles Sturt Advantage early offer program is open to Year 12 students Australia wide for 2023 entry. CSU assess two things: your Year 11 results and your 'soft' skills. In short, you need to respond to three questions demonstrating your communication, resilience, empathy and motivation.

Round 1 applications are already open meaning you could receive a course offer as early as May. Although there are three rounds, popular courses can fill up in the first round (apply by 31 March 2022) so jump online and check it out!

The Defence Industry



The 'defence industry' is the thousands of Australian businesses, men and women across the country who aren't in the Defence Force but use their expertise, experience and trade skills to supply and support it - they are The Workforce Behind The Defence Force.

A new government initiative to help build the defence industry is the virtual work experience program.

The Defence Industry Virtual Work Experience Program will provide opportunities for students who may face geographic or other barriers to participating in traditional work experience.

Students will undertake collaborative, group science, technology, engineering and maths (STEM) projects, including projects linked to real-world research and industry challenges.

The Defence Industry Virtual Work Experience Program will commence in Term 2, 2022 with a pilot of approximately 30 students. Please email workexperience@csiro.au to register for more

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Eligibility

To be eligible to participate in Virtual Work Experience, students must be:

- in Years 10 or 11, and aged 15-17 years for the duration of the work experience
- · enrolled in a school in Australia
- able to commit to the designated days as specified by the supervisor (with students seeking approval from their school) and be supported by a teacher, parent or other approved adult in their physical location throughout their work experience project.

Virtual work experience will be run by the Department of Defence in conjunction with Australia's National Science Agency, CSIRO.



Tax File Number

getting an application submitted early!

Any student will need a tax file number if he/she starts work (part-time and full-time) and all students planning on a tertiary education require one when they start.

Importantly, current Year 12 students are reminded that they will be requested to provide their Tax File Number (TFN) on enrolment to TAFE or university next year, so it is worthwhile

Students must now apply for a TFN online and have their identity verified through an interview at a <u>participating</u>
<u>Australia Post office.</u>
