Many homestay hosts tell us about the rewarding cultural experiences they gain from hosting their international students as well as the opportunities to make lifelong, global friendships.

Close and lasting personal ties are common in our homestay community. In fact, many of our homestay hosts have been to visit their old homestay students, in their countries, years later. Some have attended weddings overseas and even been to meet what they have called their 'Homestay Grandchildren' around the world.






